Identifying Significant Environmental Aspects and by setting and reviewing our environmental objectives and targets in a proactive manner.

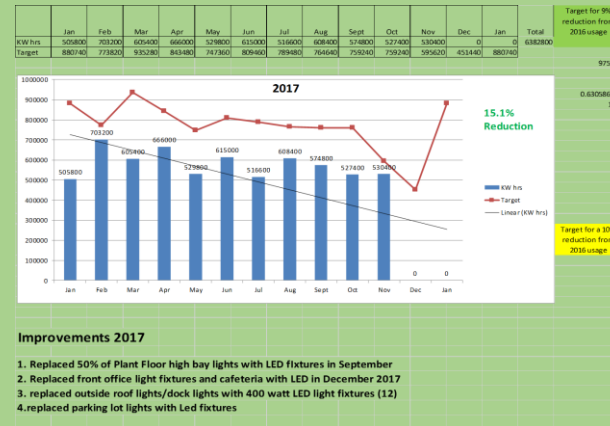
Written Operational Procedures: HTNA develops and implements written operational procedures for those work processes which have the potential to cause significant environmental impacts.

Pollution Prevention: HTNA continuously strives to prevent pollution, reduce waste and the consumption of resources (materials, fuel, and energy), and commit to recovery and recycling, as opposed to disposal, to protect the environment.

Training: HTNA provides both general and specific training to its team members on environmental protection procedures, hazardous materials handling, waste disposal and recycling.

Auditing: Environmental audits are conducted on designated equipment, environmental programs, and environmental procedures on a regular scheduled basis.

Process Reviews: New processes that are introduced to HTNA are reviewed for environmental impact prior to implementation.



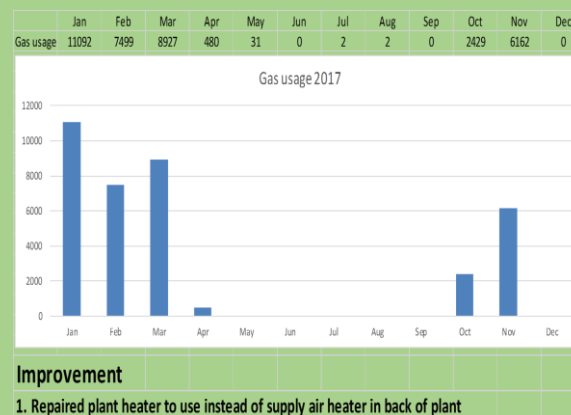
